	NON-VOLUNTARY SWIMMING ☐ Come out from under the boat - stay calm and alert – look for your boat and listen for your guide ☐ Keep your feet UP ☐ Defensive Swimming position – feet downstream, toes out of water, use backstroke and legs to push off of rocks	 □ Wear sunscreen or cover exposed skin □ Foot care □ Drink lots of water (not river water) □ Signs and symptoms of dehydration □ Stay well-nourished/comfortable: prevention □ Inform your TL if you experience health problems or use medications not disclosed on roster □ Wash hands often, before eating, after using toile □ Clean any wound immediately, tell a guide
